LITERACY BUILDING BLOCKS

- Color of the Week (T/TH class only)
 - Wear clothing the color that we are learning about that week
- The Letter Poster
 - Bring in a picture or drawing of something that begins with the "letter of the week" to create a class
 poster to be shared
- The Letter Bucket
 - Each child will have an opportunity during the year to bring home the "letter bucket"
 - They may choose up to <code>five IIEM</code> from home that start with that letter and share them with the class
- **Letters to Michael** the young man CDCA supports through Compassion International. During the year we receive updates from Michael and write return letters to him. A TYPICAL DAY AT CDCA DEVOTIONS & CLASS TIMES

Before the start of each school day, our staff sets aside the time between 8:55-9:10am to spend with the Lord in prayer and devotion.

 If you need to reach us please call prior to this time, otherwise we will check for voicemail messages once the school day begins.

Our school day runs from 9:15-11:45_{am}, with Chapel Time starting at 9:30_{am}.

- Arriving on time allows allows children to get the most out of our day together!
- Please have your child use the bathroom at home <u>before</u> they come to school, whenever possible.

A TYPICAL DAY AT CDCA DROP-OFF & PICK-UP PROCEDURES

- Arrival and departure will occur through the DOUBLE DOOKS in front of the church Sanctuary
- A friendly, MASKED, greeting:) parents may be asked to wear a mask as well
- A quick **health evaluation** of your child including a **IEMPERATURE** (laser thermometer)
- A TEACHER ESCORT of your child to and from our classroom
- If you need to pick up your child early...
 - Please inform the staff during drop-off, if possible
 - o Call the school upon your arrival and your child will be brought up to you
- If someone ITHEN YOU is picking up your child staff must be notified with a written permission slip or telephone call. We will ask to see the ID of those we are not familiar with... even parents we are still getting to know:)

A TYPICAL DAY AT CDCA MORNING ROUTINE

Our morning routine is designed to help build your child's confidence and independence by strengthening their "self-help" skills. *

- After arriving downstairs, students locate their assigned coat hook & hang up their belongings.
- Inside the classroom
 - They are welcomed by another teacher
 - Directed toward the attendance chart & choose a sticker to place by their name
 - Walk to the art sink to wash their hands
- Now our CDCA friends are ready to learn!! Either by locating their seat and beginning the "Early Bird" activity for the day or through "free-choice" playtime until Group / Chapel Time starts.

Dressing for Success at School

Our goal At CDCA is to provide a safe and encouraging environment for your child to learn and grow in. Therefore, we discourage our students from wearing clothing themes that can be considered scary. This includes images depicting violence, weapons, skulls, wizards, witches or magic items. School t-shirts will be made available for students to wear if a replacement shirt is necessary.

- Everyday your child will need:
 - A backpack name clearly labeled on the front
 - A complete change of clothing inside of their backpack
 - Comfortable play clothes that
 - Are okay to get dirty even with paint shirts, artistic masterpieces can end up on clothing
 - Your child can manage independently when using the restroom
 - o Tennis shoes or other comfortable shoes for playing outside on the playground
 - Outerwear that is appropriate for the season we play outside throughout the Fall and Spring

PLEASE LABEL ALL COATS, HATS, SCARVES & MITTENS WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.

Multiple children may own the same type of coat or hat & it isn't uncommon for a child to innocently claim an item they may like as their own. :)

SNACK TIME

Each day a thoughtfully chosen snack will be provided for your child.

- Our goal is to offer wholesome snacks free of artificial ingredients, colors, and flavors whenever possible (birthday snacks may be the exception). Your child's snack will contain items from at least two different food groups. While we always encourage our students to try new foods, they do have the option to say "no, thank you" to the snack we are serving. "Alternative" snacks will not be offered.
- Students will have the option to drink either 100% juice or water along with their snack.
- If your child has a **special dietary need** due to food allergies, sensitivities or family preferences (vegan, for example) we ask that you provide an appropriate snack for them to be served during our snack time.
 - Past families have brought in multiple packages of dietary compliant snacks for their child providing a variety snack options throughout the week.
 - Packages are labeled with the students name and placed in a special section of our snack cupboard & parents are informed when the supply is getting low.
 - Please note: Licensing requires all snacks to be in their original, nutritionally labeled packaging & snacks with an expired "best by" date cannot be served.

ABSENCES & HEALTH POLICIES

Strict adherence to our health policies is critical during the COVID-19 pandemic. We appreciate your consideration of our CDCA families and staff when making the decision as to whether or not you should send your child to school if they or someone else in your family shows any sign of illness. - Notify CDCA if your child will be absent illness, family vacation, appointment, etc.
- If your child is **absent due to illness**, please **let us know as soon as possible**. Licensing requires us to notify all parents of communicable diseases such as strep, pink eye chicken pox, lice...
- If your child displays any of the following symptoms... they SHOULD NOT attend school
 - o Fever
 - Diarrhea
 - Vomiting
 - o Cold*
 - Sore throat*
 - Coughing
 - Eye Redness*
 - o Rash*
 - Any contagious illness

HEALTH POLICIES CONTINUED

If your child is not feeling well in general, acting lethargic or out of the ordinary, please keep them at home.

- If your child were to become ill while at CDCA
 - You will be contacted & expected to pick up your child as soon as possible
 - The child will be separated from the other children
 - o A teacher will remain with the child and attend to their needs until the parent arrives to take them home
 - If a parent cannot be reached, the emergency contacts listed in the child's file will be contacted in respective order

- Please identify two individuals who are able to come pick-up your child if they become ill at school and you are unable
 to be reached.

HOUSEKEEPING ITEMS TUITION

Tuition should be paid the 1st day of each month (either by mail or placed in the check box provided at the Curbside desk)

- Two days per week: \$160.00 per month
- Three days per week: \$210.00 per month
- Bills are not mailed out unless tuition is late.

Frequently Asked Question'S

I am afraid my child will experience separation-anxiety... New experiences and new people can sometimes cause children to cling to what they find familiar...YOU. Thankfully, our staff have a few "tools in their toolboxes" to help with just that! We are prepared to provide extra love, support, and even an additional lap or two, to help your child transition into preschool.

Can my child bring in a favorite toy / blanket from home to help comfort them? Sadly, the answer is <u>no</u>. in order to protect the health and safety our students, families, and staff, we will not be allowing students to bring toys / lovies from home. Thank you for your cooperation.

What if my child wants me to walk them down to the classroom? In this situation, we ask that you "love them up" and confidently send them on their way! All students will be escorted to and from our classroom by teachers.

What is a "combined classroom" and how does it work? A "combined classroom" simply means that there are two different age groups learning and playing together. The children play, sing, exercise, and have snack as a group but the curriculum activities and Chapel Times are separate. We find that this is a wonderful way to encourage leadership skills in the older children, An added bonus - with more teachers in the classroom it is easier for students to find someone they can make a special connection with. :)

MORE...Frequently Asked Question'S

Can I volunteer to help with the class parties? We love having parent volunteers at CDCA! Our ability to have volunteers in the classroom will depend on current COVID guidelines. When opportunities to welcome volunteers arise, we will let you know.:)

Will there be a visit from Firefighter Jay and the other community helpers this fall? Good Question... If we can schedule an outside visit with these "superheroes" we certainly will!

My child has a summer birthday, will they still be able to celebrate at school? Yes! Every child, regardless of what month their birthday falls in, will have the opportunity to celebrate their birthday at school. :) Birthdays that occur while school is not in session may be celebrated in an adjoining month (for example: August birthdays being celebrated in September) or as a "half-birthday." Our Pre-K 5 students always celebrate their "half-birthday." If you have questions please speak with Mrs. Sadowski, our birthday coordinator.

What about Fall Conferences? Will you still have them? Fall Conferences will be held over the telephone. A sign-up sheet will become available in November.

Is CDCA a non-profit? YES, our school is a 501(3) C non-profit organization. Donations are accepted and a tax-deductible receipt is provided upon request. Thrivent members can chose to direct their Choice Dollars to our school.
